The event is open to students (graduate/undergraduate), professors and industry professionals and does not require a poster to attend.

Student Night will include a keynote lecture entitled "Needs in Materials for Space for the Coming Decades and How to Prepare Yourself for a Job in the Space Sector" by Dr. Marie-Josée Potvin from Canadian Space Agency. The event will include food and beverages for all participants.

Registration for the Material Advantage Student Program costs \$30 USD/year and includes membership in the foremost Materials Science and Engineering professional societies: ACerS (The American Ceramic Society), AIST (Association for Iron & Steel Technology), ASM International (The Materials Information Society) and TMS (The Minerals, Metals and Materials Society). Other benefits include access to news and lectures regarding the state-of-the-art issues in Materials, professional networking opportunities and the physical delivery of 12 journal publications.

Poster Contest Registration

Contest registration is done on an individual basis (i.e. no teams), and the posters will present your contribution to the research project. The research content should be focussed on materials science and engineering, i.e. theory, characterization and manufacturing of materials. The posters will be evaluated in two steps. First, a preliminary evaluation will be completed one week prior the event. During the Student Night, you will be evaluated on a five-minute presentation of your research to members of the judging committee.

To register for the poster competition:

- Register online for the ASM student night (see above), **BEFORE MARCH 19, 2018** and indicate in the registration form that you will participate in the poster contest.
- ➤ Following registration, you will be sent more detailed information regarding the contest, including the poster scoring rubric and the email address to submit your poster (see next item).
- > Send a PDF version of your poster, **BEFORE MARCH 21, 2018** to the email address that will be provided to you following registration to the contest.
- ➤ Print your poster. To accommodate the venue, posters must be smaller than 90 cm wide and 120 cm high. Participants will be responsible for their own printing fees!
- ➤ Install your poster before 5:00PM on March 28th, 2018.
- Present your poster to the jury on March 28th, 2018 (~5 mins/poster).

Failure to follow to these instructions may lead to poster disqualification.
